Learn how to incorporate media and marine science into your curriculum to teach science content standards, including important concepts such as ecosystems, adaptations and human impact on the environment.

This workshop will focus on why and how to use marine science to teach science content standards as well as how to use media effectively in the science classroom. Activities will include

- a discussion about the relevance of ocean issues to our lives as a basis for using marine science to teach scientific concepts
- an introduction to Ocean Literacy principles and concepts
- watching short videos and clips from the PBS series *Jean-Michel Cousteau: Ocean Adventures*, and learning different techniques for engaging students in active viewing
- an overview of the *Ocean Adventures* Web site to demonstrate how to access all of the free educational resources
- visiting the seals and sea lions at the Fresno Chaffee Zoo
- using the Fresno Chaffee Zoo as a resource for teaching marine science.
